

The scientific requirements for the doctoral degree set by the PIGTDI

Addendum to Annex 15 to the DCNSIT-DR

1. At least 5 pieces of a least 4-4 pages long articles in English.

2. At least 250% cumulative authorship in peer-reviewed journal articles of at least 4 pages in English or in articles of at least 4 pages in English published in a WoS/Scopus indexed conference.

3. At least 50% cumulative authorship of WoS impact factor English language journal articles of at least 4 pages.

4. At least a total of 150% cumulative authorship in SJR rated Q2 or above in English articles of at least 4-4 pages.

5. At least 50% cumulative authorship in journal articles published abroad and indexed by WoS or Scopous.

6. In the case of Hungarian native speakers, at least 1 journal article, scholarly article or conference paper in Hungarian.

7. At least 1 presentation in English at an international professional conference.

Only publications that are not objectionable according to the MTMT in the year of publication and that have a minimum of 12.5% of the Candidate Author's share will be considered.

The 4-page limit does not apply to highly ranked scientific journals (e.g. Nature, Science), which tend to publish articles shorter than 4 pages.

Only publications related to the topic of the theses can be taken into account for the calculation of the authorship.

The author's share is determined by dividing the number of authors evenly between the authors, excluding the consultee from the number of authors. Only one of the co-authors may be taken into account. The Candidate must indicate which of the authors he/she wishes to omit from each article.

Publications may be partially replaced by equivalent subject-specific works with the agreement of the Doctoral Council.

The scholarly activity professional weight of activity in some cases variable, therefore any publication activity should be considered only as a supplementary criterion.

Deviations from these requirements are possible by unanimous decision of the Doctoral Council. Outstanding scientific results (if at least 300% of the publication requirements for the degree have been met) may be submitted in the form of a shorter abstract (at least 30 pages) with the prior agreement of the Doctoral School Council.

A scientific result can be included as a thesis in a dissertation at most. The doctoral candidate and his/her supervisor must declare that the results described in the thesis will not be included as a thesis in another dissertation.
